

Dr. Frasier graduated from the University of Utah School of Medicine and completed a residency in Pediatrics and fellowship in Child Abuse at University of Washington/Children's Hospital of Seattle. She completed a fellowship in Child Abuse at University of Washington/Harborview Medical Center. She has been on the faculties of the University of Missouri/Columbia, the University of Iowa, and the University of Utah. Dr. Frasier is board certified in General Pediatrics and Child Abuse Pediatrics. Dr. Frasier has served as the chair of the section on Child Abuse and Neglect of the AAP, was on the first subboard for child abuse pediatrics at the American Board of Pediatrics, where she served as chair of the subboard immediate past chair. She has been on the Board of Directors of the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children, and is current chair of the board of directors of the National Center for Shaken Baby Syndrome. Dr. Frasier is Vice President/President Elect of the Ray E. Helfer Society. She is currently a Professor of Pediatrics at Penn State Milton Hershey Children's Hospital and Division Chief of Child Abuse Pediatrics. She is medical director of the PinnacleHealth Children's Resource Center, an accredited Children's Advocacy Center in Harrisburg serving 7 counties in central Pennsylvania and provides peer review via telehealth at several additional CACs. Dr. Frasier has an interest in Telehealth in child abuse, sexual abuse physical findings, and has lectured nationally and internationally on the topic of child abuse.
